6. The last province to join Canada did so in 1949. Name the province.
7. Two small islands off the south coast of Newfoundland remain a part of France. Name either of the two islands.
8. The location currently occupied by the city of Winnipeg was originally called by a different name. What was the original name?
9. Which of the following two provinces would not have been found on a map of Canada in the year 1900 - British Columbia or Saskatchewan?
10. Which of the two groups of Native Peoples was not found in Eastern Canada.
